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### Minutes

## **2. Nomination of Chairperson**

No written nominations for Chairperson were received. Verbal nominations were sought, and as there was no expression of interest from any member, Rob Wilson offered to take over the role on a temporary basis to provide time for the group to consider a new Chairperson.

## **3. Agenda items forwarded to the Secretary prior to the meeting**

No items.

## **4. Road realignment**

As the meeting was conducted during a site tour of the realigned road, Tim Evison provided an update on site. He informed the group that the road sealing and cutover was completed on 28 March, but due to some damage being caused by hooligans over Easter, repairs had to be undertaken and delayed the road becoming operational until Thursday 4 April.

Tim also advised that the bunds and fencing would be fully completed in late April/early May. The hydroseeding of the inside batters of the bunds would start when work on the swales was complete in the next couple of weeks.

Tim advised that approximately 7,000 plants have been ordered from the nursery, and would be planted in early May, leaving an area set aside for the community planting day in late May / early June.

## **5. Truck movements update**

Rob advised that four drivers had been spoken to since the last meeting in February. The new speed camera was continuing to work well. Rob said driver speeds are one of the biggest issues around the site, and they were continuing to work with CERA, attending fortnightly meetings with contractors.

Elissa Smith raised the question as to whether any of the land at Burwood Forest would be contaminated from previous uses, other than Landfill. Chris Elsmore offered to provide a Land Use map of the area at the next meeting.

## **6. Reports**

### **a. Operations**

Rob Wilson provided an update on the processing and recycling plant, construction of which has now been completed and they are in the run-up phase of checking conveyors, shakers and training personnel. Peripheral items, such as the lighting, dust suppression and covers have been fitted. The water sprays are working well and irrigation sprinklers can be used to capture excess dust if required.

### **b. Consent conditions**

The 'pile' now contained 400,000 tonnes of post earthquake waste to be processed.

The Landfill cell construction site A, which we viewed on the last site visit is now ready to receive waste.

## **7. General Business**

### **Community planting day**

It was decided a Sunday morning would be preferable. Suggested it would be late May/early June.

### **Date of next meeting**

All agreed the next meeting be held in three months on Wednesday, **10 July** at 6pm, at the Parklands Baptist Church.

### **Other issues**

- Phoebe asked that the speed signs on the closed section of the road could be removed. Tim responded that they would be moved to the new road.
- Chris Evans wanting to know if the potholes on the edges of the entrance road intersection near the new 'no stopping' poles could be looked at. Tim advised this is outside the scope of the project but will refer the matter to CCC Roothing Maintenance for attention. It was noted that the existing 'No Stopping' signage and bollards were definitely assisting to stop temporary parking of trucks and damage to the road berms.
- Suggestion by Elissa that all cities should nominate an area for handling of cleanup and demolition waste in case of future of future natural disasters. Will Burwood always be the Christchurch City 'designated site for post natural disaster waste disposal? Mark advised that the current consent for the BRRP site was only for 5 years. Any future scenario would have to be addressed at the time, however, as had been advised at earlier public meetings, the prospect that the site might be required sometime again in the future for this type of function could not be ruled out.
